Hi, I'm Tasha! I study Criminology and one thing I am super passionate about is caring! Having lost my Dad to cancer age 3 and becoming a young carer for my Mum at 8, I have grown up knowing all the different needs we all have and the support we sometimes need to keep going.

My life massively changed in 2016 when I was diagnosed with both Autism and HNPP, a genetic nerve disorder. I had grown up around disability but coming to terms with being disabled myself was difficult and somewhat scary. The massive implications it could have on all aspects of my life didn't dawn on me until I began thinking about Uni. I felt limited in so much, from career prospects to even driving a car or having my own family. These worries badly impacted my mental health at the time.

Having to combat these issues myself has given me a real passion for ensuring that others do not have a hard time accessing support. I want to change the support we do offer to ensure it is suited and mouldable to people's needs. After all, we're all different, so shouldn't the support be tailored to individuals rather than a mould we don't all fit into?

What I want to achieve!

Being disabled isn't a choice. And places being fully accessible and supportive to all kinds of disabilities shouldn't be a choice either. I'd love to be elected as your Disabled Students Officer, because I think I could make a huge difference to the way we support disabled students both on and off campus. I'd like to:

- Ensure that everyone has the same opportunities and support!
- Break down the barriers that can currently prevent everyone accessing this support.
- Make sure everyone feels listened to and given a voice to say what they feel needs to change!
- Improve the awareness of disabilities in the University, especially invisible disabilities which are too often ignored.
- Improve the accessibility on campus. Including developing a map that allows disabled students to plan accessible routes around campus and find appropriate facilities for their needs.
- Build a fully accessible sensory garden on campus for students/staff to unwind in. Along with other positive changes to better support student's mental health and wellbeing. This will also promote sustainability on campus!
- Improve the accessibility and speed of support services. Everyone should be able to easily gather information on all these services and have equal access to them.
- Increase the number of fully accessible and inclusive events that cater to the needs of different disabilities. No one should ever feel their disabilities exclude them!
