


My Goals

My Pledges

Equalise Mitigating Circumstances

At the moment, the mitigating circumstances policy gives students different deadlines based on whether they are campus-based or distance-learning, undergraduate or postgraduate, have evidence or not. This means there can be several different submission dates for just one assignment. I propose a review of the mitigating circumstances policy to simplify it and make it fairer for everybody.

Digitise All Required Reading

The University Library has committed to making sure that all required and suggested reading be digitised to improve accessibility for all students. This is an ongoing project and I plan on working with the library to digitise readings where possible, and working with staff to find alternatives when digital versions are not available.


Improve Personal Tutoring

Personal tutors are meant to email their tutees regularly, but this is often not the case. I plan on working with staff in every department to emphasis the importance of the personal tutor system, as well as raising awareness amongst students of the personal tutor policy so that students know when they are not getting the support they are entitled to, and how to call it out when this happens.

Mental Health and Community

Many students at university don't feel like part of the community, and not having this community can take a toll on their mental health. Attending events alone can often seem daunting for many, so I suggest creating a platform, such as Facebook or Discord, to allow students the opportunity to mingle with like-minded people in a less socially-stressful environment.


Leicester 100

MY EXPERIENCE

As your current Liberation Officer and candidate for Education Officer, I bring proven experience in advocacy and student representation. As Liberation Officer, I have led several impactful projects, including:

Hi, I'm Aishwarya Kote— a curious international student who packed her dreams and a suitcase to chase an education that goes beyond textbooks. Coming from India in January 2024 to pursue my master's in international business, I quickly realized that every academic challenge is an opportunity to create meaningful change. My own journey of adapting to a new educational system, navigating cultural differences, and overcoming unexpected hurdles has transformed me from a student into an advocate. I've learned that education isn't just about grades — it's about breaking barriers, understanding diverse perspectives, and empowering every single student to reach their full potential.

- 1. Established the Liberation Council to represent all underrepresented students at the university, creating a platform to discuss campaign ideas and policy changes.
- 2. Organized Global Fusion Fest to celebrate International Students Day, which brought diverse cultures together with over 150 students attending. This first-of-its-kind event featured successful collaborations with student societies, external stakeholders, and officers. I'm currently working to establish this as an annual tradition through official policy.
- 3. Coordinated a comprehensive Black History Month celebration featuring exhibitions, talks on Black Excellence, interactive workshops, and film screenings that engaged dozens of students and promoted greater cultural understanding on campus.
- 4. Launched Neurodiversity Celebration Week in collaboration with Students' Union staff, council members, and our Accessibility Officer.
- 5. Led the "Bridging the Gap Listening Event" initiative alongside the university's Black Student Experience Team and SU President. This listening event gathered valuable feedback from Black students about their experiences at the university that relates to the awarding gap and other aspects of the university. If elected, I will continue this valuable work, to transform student feedback into concrete actions, ensuring fair academic outcomes for all.

I commit to supporting students with academic appeals, advocating for appropriate resit and dissertation timeframes, and resolving conflicts between academic deadlines and visa requirements. I will ensure international students receive CAS extensions when needed to complete their degrees without immigration complications.

Additionally, I will push for policy changes to allow neurodivergent students and those with learning difficulties to receive extra time for coursework. Currently, these students are denied this support under mitigating circumstances policies, as their conditions are considered "not unforeseen." However, this fails to acknowledge the unique challenges they face in processing information and completing tasks within standard timeframes. I will advocate for the university to revise its policy or introduce a dedicated process for these students to request additional time, ensuring a more equitable and supportive learning environment.

02. BREAKING DOWN FINANCIAL BARRIERS AND PROMOTING TRANSPARENCY

I commit to introducing innovative financial support systems, including flexible fee payment plans and establishing a loan scheme for essential academic items, while partnering with National Union of Students to campaign for fair work conditions.

03. TRANSFORMING THE POSTGRADUATE RESEARCH EXPERIENCE

I will implement a Supervisor Excellence Program with mandatory training and enhance PGR support structures by streamlining processes, improving resource access, and standardizing support roles across departments.

O4. SUPPORTING DISTANCE LEARNING, INTERNATIONAL, AND COMMUTER STUDENTS

I pledge to streamline visa processing and develop comprehensive guidance for international students, while advocating for commuter-friendly timetabling and more relaxed student spaces on campus. I will advocate for better virtual engagement, ensuring distance learning students have equal access to academic support, career services, and networking opportunities.

O5. COLLEGE-SPECIFIC IMPROVEMENTS AND TARGETED SUPPORT

- Transform Brookfield into a vibrant student hub by extending café hours beyond 2-3 PM and establish a separate academic group within the College of Business to create a structured and sustainable way to engage students and promote participation.
- Address critical timetabling issues between Brookfield and main campus.

- Create dedicated spaces to combat isolation for arts students during self-study periods
- Integrate more industry-relevant practical skills in Arts, Media, and Communication courses
- Provide additional support for Law students managing large reading lists and cohort sizes

College of Science & Engineering (CSE)

- Secure quality alternative spaces for students affected by building closures
- Address teaching consistency in Engineering, particularly during staff changes

College of Life Sciences (CLS)

- Broaden career pathway presentations beyond traditional routes

What does accessibility mean to

me?



What makes me qualified to be accessibility officer?

I have generalised hypermobility spectrum disorder and suspected autism spectrum disorder, both of these mean I have faced difficulties with accessibility all my life. One of the biggest struggles I have faced is my symptoms being overlooked by my support systems.

I also work at a school/care home for children with profound autism and other learning disabilities. I have also worked with other conditions here, like ADHD, OCD, trauma, Williams syndrome and this job has helped me learn the process of introducing reasonable accommodations and how much of a struggle daily life can be when society is not set up to work with you.

Accessibility means trying to ensure that everyone access to equal opportunities. It means not being held back by something out of my control, avoiding stigma, feeling heard and not overlooked. It means feeling accepted by a community who understand you.

Get to know me



Hi, my name is Hannah, I am a 20 year old psychology student. Things I enjoy are reading romance books and pole dance in my free time. My future career aspirations are to become a clinical psychologist but at the moment I work at a care home/school for children with severe autism and other disabilities. learning holidays, I go to Germany to see my family and can speak the language fluently. I am passionate about bringing attention to the myths surrounding mental health, specifically in women. Something I would like to learn is British sign language. My favourite takeaway is Nandos, I live with 2 of my friends and a cat (Ember).

Myth Busting Campaign

Something I have noticed throughout my studies and working with people with disabilities is the number of myths or negative stereotypes which surround various conditions. As an accessibility officer I would really like to debunk some of these false ideas using an education-based online campaign, spreading accurate information about conditions, including information on where to get help if you believe you are struggling with this. Another thing I would emphasize during this campaign is the inclusion of gender and cultural differences within each disorder as these are often ignored. An example of this in action may be explaining what OCD (obsessive-compulsive disorder) truly looks like, how it's not just being 'clean' and what this condition's struggles may look like.



Change in Training for Staff and Societies



Based off research I have done within the university, I have noticed that the training provided to staff and societies is very information driven and does not work to get people to truly understand what living with a disability looks like. I would like to introduce an interactive training opportunity for staff and societies which puts them in the position of someone disability, for example, using the video "Can you make it to the end?" by the National Autistic Society or dyslexia simulation activity. This will increase empathy and understanding and will put accessibility and accommodations at the forefront of their minds.

Networking Activities

One thing I would like to Implement if I become your accessibility officer is introducing safe spaces for people with disabilities to come together. I believe this will be particularly helpful for those in a position with mental conditions where the wait list is extremely long and people are stuck in the pre-diagnosis phase. This will hopefully introduce people in similar positions together so they can relate to each other and discuss struggles and coping mechanisms.



Waitingtimes



Something else I have noticed is the long waiting times to get support through the university, especially for mental health concerns and getting accommodations put in place. I would like to implement a funnel system, within which the first point of access is getting daily level accommodations put in place by your school, rather than at a university level to attempt to streamline the process. This way immediate change is more likely and you have support while waiting to get through to Access Ability.

Suggestions and Advice

I would like to introduce a suggestions and advice service. This would be a space for you to bring attention to accessibility issues you have faced during university, as well as suggestions you may have to make the university more accessible. This would be able to then help signpost to where you need to go to try and make accommodation, including for financial support and how to receive this if you are eligible. We would then be able to introduce initiatives based on what you have said is lacking.
