Madhavi has pushed for re-introducing the free breakfast scheme on all weekdays to serve the community, this began again in mid-February and has been a success thus far.

Madhavi's attempts to connect with this smaller cohort have been received well by the community who answered multiple surveys set up by Madhavi and they facilitated discussions around what students need from them as an officer, the answers to which are still being filtered through and will be passed onto the next officer in this role to tackle.
